IF YOU WANT THIS KIND OF INVOLVEMENT, THEN BY ALL MEANS APPLY FOR HONOURS. 2002 INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICATION OF U2 OR U3 STUDENTS TO THE HONOURS PROGRAMME

Admissions to Honours will take place at the beginning of the U2 year. Students who entered U1 the previous January and have completed one term of U1 are also eligible to apply. Science students intending to apply should have completed the U1 requirements for the major psychology programme. Arts students should have completed 204-204, 204-211, 204-212, 204-213 and 204-215 in U1. Students in both Arts and Science faculties are also highly recommended to complete 204-305 in U1. Application should be made after your report of standing is available. Students with a cumulative GPA of 2.6 (Faculty of Arts) or 2.8 (Faculty of Science) are eligible to apply; however, during the past several years it has been possible to accept a maximum of 30 students with averages above 3.5 based on a 27-30 credit programme. Evaluation of your application will be made on the basis of academic standing. Please note, however, that a GPA of 3.5 does not guarantee admission. Performance in the Psychology U1 core courses is a <u>very important factor</u> in the admission decision.

A few students may be admitted into the U3 (final year) Honours Programme on the basis of two criteria: GPA above 3.5 and previous research experience. Because the current class is already large, acceptance of students into the U3 class depends on others dropping out.
